Educational Programs - Early Learning

UCC Early Childhood Education Program – A comprehensive and nurturing early childhood education program including Head Start and Early Head Start, serving children six weeks to four years of age in an educationally rich bilingual environment. The program focuses on fostering the development of social, emotional, and intellectual skills to ensure children are confident to experience, explore, and engage in the world around them.

Program Highlights:

- Early Learning services available year-round on our campuses
- Early Learning (six weeks four-year-old kindergarten) enrollment is at an all-time high serving more than 450 children across four Centers
- New UCC Ricardo Diaz Early Learning Academy opened in April 2021 with 70 total children. Enrollment has more than doubled, currently serving more than 160 children at this facility
- UCC Burnham Campus officially opened February 2022 to meet the continual demand of high-quality early education opportunities for infant/toddler care in the Burnham Park Neighborhood

Human Services

UCC offers treatment and recovery services to men and women who have a substance use disorder. UCC serves individuals with co-occurring disorders, Spanish-speaking clients, and participants in the Adult and Family Drug Treatment Court programs. Programs are trauma informed, and gender and culturally appropriate.

UCC recognizes that our clients often have one or more accompanying medical issues. Our initiative includes connecting every residential client with a primary care physician and providing health education.

Residential Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) Treatment – 24 hour care residential treatment facilities offer comprehensive services to men and women, including pregnant and post-partum women and their children. Services include case management, medication assisted treatment, individual and group counseling, peer support, urinalysis testing, educational and vocational skill development, parenting education, relapse prevention, art therapy, and fitness membership.

Outpatient and Day Treatment – Services include counseling, education, health and life skills, peer support, parenting classes, mental health, and relapse prevention.

Recovery Support Coordination (RSC) – Comprehensive strength-based case management services designated to provide individuals with a substance use disorder and their families support in their recovery.

Program Highlights:

- 585 clients served throughout our continuum of care
- 215 served in Residential Treatment (impacted by COVID restrictions)
- In addition, 14 children were served in the Residential Treatment program with their mothers, and 147 who lived off campus
- Served 436 clients in 2021 through Recovery

Elderly Programs

Senior Center – A safe and culturally sensitive environment for older Latino adults to gather with friends and enjoy recreational, educational, and wellness activities. This Milwaukee County Senior Meal Site provides nutritious meals five days per week and also offers a monthly Food Box through the Hunger Task Force.

Adult Day Center – A home-like environment which provides support and respite services for frail elders and those with physical disabilities or dementia. The center offers meals, health care, personal care services, and culturally sensitive activities.


Memory Clinic – In collaboration with Froedtert/Medical College of Wisconsin and the Alzheimer's Association, UCC offers the only memory disorders clinic in the state of Wisconsin specifically serving Latino adults with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias.

UCC – US Bank Village and Olga Village – Apartments on the UCC campus that offer local elderly affordable living and the convenient opportunity to participate in UCC activities. It's operated in partnership with Capri Communities and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

My Choice Family Care – Medicaid long-term care program for eligible adults with physical or developmental/intellectual disabilities and frail elders. MCFC provides care management services, coordination of care, assessment, and comprehensive member center planning to help individuals meet their long-term care needs.

Transportation Services – UCC offers transportation for seniors to participate in UCC Elderly Programs.

Program Highlights:

- Fully reopened both the Adult Day Center and Senior Center to in-person services after being closed due to COVID
- Continued meal delivery and curbside pick up dining until we were able to reopen onsite dining in August. Total meals provided for the year was 29,981
- We were the only meal site in Milwaukee County that reopened in-person operations in 2021 while keeping all of our seniors happy and safe
- Provided virtual programming to keep seniors connected, including exercise, art, reading, and meditation
- 67 Elderly participated at the Adult Day Center in 2021
- Of those, 20 were attending for the first time
- Latino Geriatric Center and Mobile Memory Clinic conducted
 57 assessments, facilitated 35 doctor evaluations, and provided family caregiver education to 34 participants



Bruce-Guadalupe Community School (BGCS) – A multicultural public charter school for children in K-3 through 8th grades delivering a curriculum that fosters high expectations and emphasizes core academics. Programming beyond the school day is offered to students providing them well-rounded school experiences.

UCC Acosta Middle School (UCC AMS) – A 6th-8th grade public charter school emphasizing literacy, math, science, and technology with an environment that fosters high expectations, hard work, and parental involvement to equip students with the skills to be competitive in dynamic future job markets.

Summer School – A 19-day program designed to enhance academic performance within core subjects during the morning while providing recreational and enrichment activities in the afternoon.

Afterschool Programming – Wrap-around services for students of all ages in the areas of academic, cultural, and athletic activities. Programs range from tutoring, homework help, sports, music, and school clubs.







Program Highlights:

- Re-opened all school buildings at 100% capacity in August 2021. All buildings remained open the entire school year, despite the various challenges of the pandemic's variants
- After-school athletic programs resumed
- Grades 5K 8 implemented a new literacy curriculum program to address the needs of students
- Began a new partnership with Sixteenth Street Community Health Center to expand health care programs available to UCC students and families
- Expanded programming at Acosta Middle School in STEM, afterschool clubs, and hands-on experiences

UCC Neighborhood Development Initiative

Neighborhood Development Initiative -

Designed to increase neighborhood stability in the area surrounding UCC by increasing home ownership, rehabilitating houses, and assisting residents through credit and home-buyer counseling along with home repair workshops.

Program Highlights

- Facilitated 199 home closings
- Educated more than 494 clients across 24 homebuyer seminars and one-on-one counseling
- \$28,313,239 invested in the Milwaukee community.

Pre-College Program

Pre-College Program – Comprehensive services for high school students and their families to assist with the pursuit of post-secondary education including college application and admissions processes, test-taking skills, financial aid applications, and college visits. Curriculum delivers content to each grade level in the areas of academic success, financial literacy, social-emotional health, community development, and leadership.

UCC College Network – Supports undergraduate students from traditionally underserved backgrounds (low-income, minority, first-generation) to remain in, persist through, and graduate from college through case management, professional development training, workshops, and networking opportunities.







Program Highlights:

- Expanded the program to 580 UCC alumni (grades 9-12) enrolled at over 40 different high schools
- 150 students participated in Youth Volunteer Corps service learning program over the summer, which includes volunteering opportunities such as neighborhood clean ups and making care packages for homeless shelters
- 100% of graduating seniors who applied to college received at least one acceptance letter
- Expanded middle school programming including drug and alcohol prevention, sexual risky behavior avoidance curriculums, and high school placement assistance for families
- Expanded parent and family programming including teenage communications strategies, physical activity and fitness, and academic support skills for the home

Health & Fitness

Athletics – A full range of activities for youth including the FIT KIDS program, boxing, soccer, basketball, football, volleyball, golf, cross country running, fitness club, triathlon club, and youth soccer clinics, volleyball clinics, flag football clinics and several fitness and wellness programs for students and families of various ages.

Cesar Pabon Fitness Center – A community fitness center offering cardiovascular and strength-building equipment, aerobics, and ondemand fitness classes.

Student Health Center – On-site health care and preventative services provided by Carroll University faculty and nursing students, as well as 16th Street Community Health Centers.

Health Research – Facilitating collaborations with area research universities (such as Medical College of Wisconsin, UW-Milwaukee, UW-Madison, Marquette University, Carroll University) and other community partners in a variety of community-based health research projects or health prevention programs, to address health disparities and increase health outcomes in our community.

Athletics Program Highlights:

- Since April of 2021, school athletics has been in full swing, with more than
 1,000 youth and 60 volunteer participants
- Middle School Girls' Basketball team took first place in the basketball league for the first time in school history
- The UCC boxing club has the #2 ranked boxer at 132lbs and 5 boxers ranked in their divisions in the country









Health Research Program Highlights:

- Received \$200,000 in grants from the Wisconsin Department of Health services to conduct COVID-19 vaccination community outreach educational activities and vaccine clinics, in collaboration with the National Association of Hispanic Nurses-Milwaukee Chapter, Hayat Pharmacy, and the Latino Medical Students Organization (MCW)
- Awarded a \$1 million grant that will assist the
 Latino Geriatric Center Memory Clinic to establish
 a SE Wisconsin regional dementia health consortium
 to expand the use of telehealth dementia assessments
 and virtual services for Latinos, in collaboration with the
 ADRC offices of Waukesha, Racine, Kenosha, and
 Milwaukee counties, and ProHealth Care
